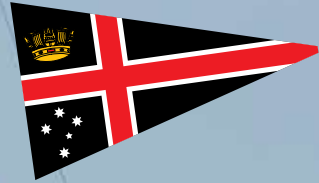

On Thursday 26 January 2017, on one of the greatest waterways in the world, we will celebrate the 181st Australia Day Regatta. The celebrations on Sydney Harbour are the oldest continuously-run sailing regatta in the world. Hundreds of sailors and their families will participate in this wonderful spectacle, which has been held every year since 1837.

As an indication of its longevity, the first Anniversary Regatta (as it was then known) was held just one year after South Australia was proclaimed a colony and before Victoria, Queensland or Tasmania (or Van Diemen's Land, as it was still called in 1837) were formally declared provinces.

There is surely no better way to mark the birth of a nation surrounded by sea, founded across the sea and developed through our great maritime heritage than by taking part in the Australia Day Regatta. We would be delighted if you could join us for the 2017 regatta by entering your yacht – be it large or small, old or new – and invite your family and friends to come along and be part of this great day afloat.

Among the grand fleet of vessels on Sydney Harbour will be tall ships, modern yachts of all descriptions, classic heritage gaff-rigged boats, modern and traditional skiffs as well as the famous Sydney ferries, naval and merchant ships and hundreds of spectator craft, all flying the Australian flag. There will be parallel on-water celebrations hosted by more than 20 sailing clubs whose involvement has enabled Australia Day to be celebrated on waterways across the State.

We are pleased to acknowledge the Armed Services for their continuing support. Their contribution to our Australia Day celebrations is much appreciated and welcomed by the Australian community. We particularly wish to thank the Royal Australian Navy for the provision of the flagship for the Regatta.

To all participants we extend our best wishes for a safe and enjoyable Australia Day on the water.
