Australia Day has a special significance for those of us who find our fun on the water.

When Governor Philip raised the Union Jack at Sydney Cove and proclaimed the new colony on January 26, 1788, he'd been brought 11,000 miles – and rowed ashore – by sailors.

The modern nation of Australia would simply not exist without the courage and skill of generations of seafarers. Sailors transported the people and goods that founded our colonies. They made the wealth of Australia possible by taking our gold, wool and wheat to foreign markets.

It is fitting, then, that an essential part of the Australia Day celebrations should be an annual regatta, open to all.

First held in 1837 and originally known as the "Anniversary Day Regatta", the event is now the oldest continually conducted sailing regatta in the world. While media attention tends to centre on Sydney Harbour, there are popular regatta events staged on most of the coastal, inland and enclosed waters of New South Wales including Pittwater, Botany Bay, Lake Macquarie, Lake Illawarra and Port Hacking.

It has been especially pleasing to see the growing involvement of our young sailors in the regatta. Many of the state's most active dinghy clubs now stage special races on Australia Day and we encourage the coming generation of champions to join this most enjoyable way of celebrating our national day.

Above all, the regatta has always been meant as a pleasant opportunity for families and friends to get out on the water. From the latest ocean racing yachts to historic 18-foot skiffs, hundreds of different sailing craft will come together in common cause. And it is an event that happily crosses all boundaries. As early as 1844 The Sydney Morning Herald was able to report of the regatta:

"Yesterday persons of all ranks in society were to be seen afloat, the Governor, judges, bishops, officers, merchants, tradesmen, mechanics, and labourers; it would be difficult to say which were the most happy; but perhaps the lower we descend in the scale of society, the more perfect was the enjoyment."

Our thanks go to all the organisations that have supported the event, and the hundreds of volunteers who take on the huge task of staging the individual races. We must also recognize the contribution of the Australian Defence Force for the provision of a Flagship for the regatta.

Come and join us for the 182nd Australia Day Regatta. We look forward to seeing you out there.

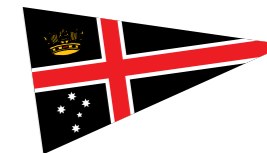
