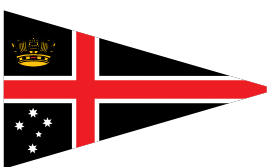

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT & CHAIRMAN

Fellow sailors,

The past year has been a testing time for all Australians. The great bonds of national unity that we take for granted came under enormous strain as the COVID-19 pandemic changed almost every aspect of our lives. But despite those tensions the country held together – and sport played a significant part in that process.

Seafaring has been crucial to our history. Cook's navigational mastery brought him to Botany Bay. Without Captain Arthur Phillip's leadership the First Fleet might not have completed its daunting journey from England to proclaim the new colony at Sydney Cove on January 26, 1788. A century later, in 1891, Australia's founding fathers met on a paddle steamer anchored in The Basin at Pittwater to agree a draft Constitution for the new nation.

It is fitting that those same three stretches of water – Botany Bay, Sydney Harbour and Pittwater – are today among the most prominent locations for the Australia Day Regatta, the event that celebrates the foundation of our nation. First held in 1837, the Regatta is the oldest continuously-run annual sailing event in the world.

We would be delighted if you could join us for the 185th Australia Day Regatta on 26 January 2021. The regatta has a wide range of individual events and is open to all. From ocean racers and classic gaff-riggers to radio-controlled yachts and historic skiffs, more than 20 participating clubs across NSW will offer racing in an appealing variety of craft. No yacht is too large or small to enjoy this wonderful day afloat.

We are pleased to acknowledge the Armed Services for their continuing support. Their contribution to our Australia Day celebrations is much appreciated. We particularly wish to thank the Royal Australian Navy for the provision of the flagship for the Regatta.

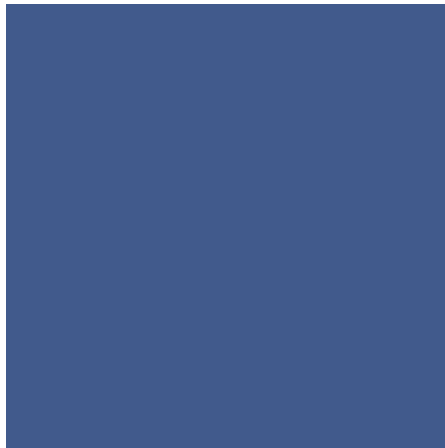
